

## Interview Preparation

1. Are you speaking any other languages or dialects?
2. Do you have any other nationalities?
3. Are you belonging to a certain ethnic group/tribe?
4. Do you have any personal documents, for example passport, ID-Card?
5. Did you have any personal documents in your home country?
6. Because of which reasons, you do not have any personal documents in your home country?
7. Do you have any other documents about your person? For example certificates, birth-certificates, military pass, driving licence, school certificate?
8. Do you or did you have a Visa or invitation for the Bundesrepublik of Germany or any other country?
9. Please tell me the last official address in your home country? Did you stay at this address until you leave the country? If not, where else did you stay?
10. Please name your family name, name, birthday, birthplace of your partner/wife as well as date and place of marriage.
11. Where does she/he live (address)?
12. Do you have children? Please tell me their names and birth dates/places. Can you give me any evidence about it?
13. What is their address?
14. What are your parents names and their address?
15. Do you have any sisters or brothers, uncles, aunts... who are not living in your home country?
16. Are there any other relatives living in your country?
17. What's the name of your fathers father? What's his date of birth?
18. Which school / university did you visit?
19. Which profession do you have? Where did you work last? Did you have a business?
20. Did you join the army?
21. Have you ever been to Germany before?
22. Did you already demand for asylum in another state or did you get refugee status somewhere else?
23. Did any of your relatives apply for asylum in another state or did he/she get refugee status?
  
24. Please explain how and when you reached Germany.  
Please explain when and in which way you left your home country, which countries you passed and how you enter into Germany.

The interviewer now explains to the interviewee, that he/she now may speak about his/her prosecution and the reasons for his/her asylum application. He/She is asked to speak about the reasons, why he/she is in fear of political prosecution.

[Please note: *The following questions are only examples for questions which might be asked – sometimes there are no questions asked at all, so now this is the time to speak/report about*  
*a) your reasons why you left you country of origin*  
*b) your reasons why you cannot go back*]

25. Detail- questions 1:

- naming details and times – when you left the country, when you reached Germany, what times flights or ships/boats go...
- describing the environment of air plane, airport, ship, uniforms, food, amount of people who travelled with you, describing trains or buses you took
- who helped you, which passports did you use
- was there any controlling, if yes-where?
- Which countries did you pass – how long did you stay there
- describe everything which you see as important to notice to make your journey true
26. Have you been political active in your home country?
27. What happened to you in your home country?
28. Detail questions 2:
- why did you have problem?
  - Who give you problem? Proofs about it?
  - What happened concrete to you (attacks, arrests, beating, killing tires...)
  - when did it happen
  - how many times did attacks happen to you?
  - Why do you think there would be a problem if you go back? What would happen to you?
  - Who else had been affected? (friends, family, people who worked with you...)
  - did you not have possibility to hide yourself or go to another country?
29. How was your economic Standard in your country?
30. How is your health condition? Are you feeling allright? Are there any health-difficulties?
31. How was the communication with the translator? If it was not so good – make it clear!
32. Is there any information you would like to add?

After the interview:

I would like resign to a re-translation -

- you would like to have a re-translation of the protocol, so thyt you can control the translation by the translator
